Free flood recovery hard-waste collections

Additional hard waste collection are now available for households impacted by the October 2022 flood.

Collections are available for six-weeks on Mondays between 31 March and 5 May 2025.

Bookings are open and must be made by phoning Council on 9688 0200 and requesting a **flood recovery collection**.

Planning and building assistance rebate scheme

This is a reminder that the applications for the PBARS scheme provided by the Department of Transport and Planning and facilitated through Windermere close on 31 May.

The scheme provides residents who meet the criteria with a rebate of up to \$3000.
