


**NOTICE OF AN APPLICATION FOR AN AMENDMENT TO A PLANNING PERMIT

The land affected by the application is located at:	3 Harris Street Footscray, 3a Harris Street Footscray, 212 Whitehall Street Footscray
The application is to amend Permit No.2009.649 by:	<p>The proposal is briefly summarised as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Section 72 amendment to extend the red line area into the parklet structure to Harris Street. • The area will be used between 9.00am – 11.00pm Monday to Saturday and 1.00pm to 6.00pm Sunday, with a maximum of 80 people (inclusive of the approved 250 patrons within the site)
The existing permit allows:	Buildings and works and use of the land generally in accordance with the endorsed plans and permit conditions for the purpose of a tertiary institution (music, dance art and theatre performance and/or music, dance, art and theatre production studios), rehearsal and artists studios. And place of assembly (Function Centre), a food and drink premises, office, indoor recreation facility, the sale and consumption of liquor, display business identification and internally illuminated signage, alteration of access to a road in a Transport 2 Zone, and dispensation in car parking requirements in accord with clause 52.06-1 of the Maribyrnong Planning Scheme

The responsible authority must make a copy of every objection available for any person to inspect free of charge until the end of the period during which an application may be made for review of a decision on the application.
