Over the last 10 years, Maribyrnong City Council's StreetWORKS program has created innovative street art to enliven public spaces and enhance the visual attractiveness and liveability of our City.

The program inspires mutual respect by linking professional artists with property owners and businesses to express our City's local stories, environments, and social or cultural themes.

StreetWORKS allows for the arts to inspire, uplift and connect the entire community.

In 2023, Council received State Government investment to expand the StreetWORKS program within Footscray's central business district.

The Illuminate Footscray commission artistically revives the façade on 88 Hopkins St, Footscray with a light-based public art commission that reflects the spatial synergy and ever-shifting essence of Footscray's community.


